A BILL

To support programs and services under the Older Americans Act of 1965 through innovation and modernization, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Revitalizing the Aging
5 Network Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FUNDING FOR THE AGING NETWORK AND INFRA-**
7 **STRUCTURE.**

8 (a) APPROPRIATION.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—In addition to amounts oth-
10 erwise available, there are appropriated for fiscal

1 year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not
2 otherwise appropriated, to the Department of Health
3 and Human Services—

4 (A) such sums as may be necessary to
5 carry out part B of title III of the Older Ameri-
6 cans Act of 1965 (42 U.S.C. 3030d et seq.), in-
7 cluding for—

8 (i) supportive services of the type
9 made available for fiscal year 2021 and au-
10 thorized under such part;

11 (ii) investing in the aging network for
12 the purposes of improving the availability
13 of supportive services, including investing
14 in the aging network workforce;

15 (iii) the acquisition, alteration, or ren-
16 ovation of facilities, including multipurpose
17 senior centers, intergenerational shared-
18 site models, and mobile units; and

19 (iv) construction or modernization of
20 facilities to serve as multipurpose senior
21 centers;

22 (B) such sums as may be necessary to
23 carry out part C of title III of such Act (42
24 U.S.C. 3030d–21 et seq.), including to support
25 the modernization of infrastructure and tech-

1 nology, including kitchen equipment and deliv-
2 ery vehicles, to support the provision of con-
3 gregate nutrition services and home delivered
4 nutrition services under such part;

5 (C) such sums as may be necessary to
6 carry out part E of title III of such Act (42
7 U.S.C. 3030s et seq.), including section 373(e)
8 of such Act (42 U.S.C. 3030s-1(e));

9 (D) such sums as may be necessary to
10 carry out title VI of such Act (42 U.S.C. 3057
11 et seq.), including part C of such title (42
12 U.S.C. 3057k-11 et seq.);

13 (E) such sums as may be necessary to
14 carry out the long-term care ombudsman pro-
15 gram under title VII of such Act (42 U.S.C.
16 3058 et seq.);

17 (F) such sums as may be necessary for
18 technical assistance centers or national resource
19 centers supported under such Act, including all
20 such centers that received funding under title
21 IV of such Act (42 U.S.C. 3031 et seq.) for fis-
22 cal year 2021, in order to support technical as-
23 sistance and resource development related to
24 culturally appropriate care management and
25 services for older individuals with the greatest

1 social need, including racial and ethnic minority
2 individuals;

3 (G) such sums as may be necessary for
4 technical assistance centers or national resource
5 centers supported under such Act that are fo-
6 cused on providing services for older individuals
7 who are underserved due to their sexual ori-
8 entation or gender identity; and

9 (H) such sums as may be necessary to
10 carry out section 417 of such Act (42 U.S.C.
11 3032f).

12 (2) AVAILABILITY.—Amounts appropriated by
13 this subsection shall remain available until expended.

14 (b) REQUIREMENTS FOR RECIPIENTS OF FUND-
15 ING.—

16 (1) COORDINATION.—Any entity receiving
17 funds made available under this section shall coordi-
18 nate, to the extent practicable, activities with organi-
19 zations providing the same services as those funded
20 under this section, or facilitating the delivery of such
21 services, to older individuals served by the Older
22 Americans Act of 1965.

23 (2) SUBMISSION OF DATA.—An entity receiving
24 funds made available under this section shall submit
25 relevant data as the Assistant Secretary may require

1 for purposes of the evaluation conducted under sub-
2 section (c).

3 (c) PROGRAM EVALUATION.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 6 years after
5 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Assistant
6 Secretary, shall by grant, contract, or interagency
7 agreement—

8 (A) evaluate the outcomes of all projects or
9 activities supported by funds made available
10 under this section; and

11 (B) submit a report on such evaluation to
12 Congress.

13 (2) CONTENTS.—The report required under
14 paragraph (1) shall describe—

15 (A) the innovations in program and service
16 delivery undertaken through funds made avail-
17 able under this section;

18 (B) the impact of such innovations on the
19 communities served by such programs or serv-
20 ices and the entities providing the programs or
21 services; and

22 (C) the impact of such innovations on
23 older individuals participating in such programs
24 or services.

1 (d) SUPPLEMENT, NOT SUPPLANT.—Funds made
2 available under this section shall be used to supplement,
3 and not supplant, any Federal, State, or other funds oth-
4 erwise available to provide programs and services to older
5 individuals.

6 (e) NONAPPLICABILITY OF CERTAIN REQUIRE-
7 MENTS.—The non-Federal contribution requirements
8 under sections 304(d)(1)(D) and 431(a) of the Older
9 Americans Act of 1965 (42 U.S.C. 3024(d)(1)(D); 42
10 U.S.C. 3033(a)), and section 373(h)(2) of such Act (42
11 U.S.C. 3030s–1(h)(2)), shall not apply to—

12 (1) any amounts made available under this sec-
13 tion; or

14 (2) any amounts made available under section
15 2921 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021
16 (Public Law 117–2).

17 (f) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the terms “aging
18 network”, “Assistant Secretary”, and “older individual”
19 have the meanings given such terms in section 102 of the
20 Older Americans Act of 1965 (42 U.S.C. 3002).
