Digester #4 is a piece of equipment that has been in an inoperable state since 2010 and needs major rehabilitation. This would increase the plant's solids (sludge) handling capacity/capabilities and position the plant to serve additional communities in the region, as wastewater capacity in the region is critical to addressing the rapid growth in the state
Tucson Water Recharge Expansion Project	City of Tucson	\$1,250,000	This project would add a fourth basin to expand recharge capacity to 8,000 acre-feet per year further increasing its beneficial use as a renewable resource. The additional basin will provide a reliable and sustainable source of water in an area of the Tucson Basin where the aquifer is observing declining groundwater level trends due to limited natural recharge ensuring a reliable source of water for generations to come.
Gilbert Rehabilitation of Stormwater Pump Station	Town of Gilbert	\$600,000	This will upgrade an aging pumping station's controls and backup power connection to reduce flooding at a below grade railroad crossing located in a key economic and transportation corridor for the area.
Mesa AMI Smart Meters	City of Mesa	\$800,000	This project will allow the City of Mesa to better monitor water usage at homes and businesses and prevent water loss.
Mesa Water Main Improvements	City of Mesa	\$959,752	These funds will allow the City of Mesa to purchase equipment to inspect and repair its water transmission mains to maximize the efficiency of the distribution system to reduce water loss.
Tolleson Drinking Water Storage Tank	City of Tolleson	\$959,752	The City of Tolleson has a drinking water storage tank that is beyond repair. This project will install a new 2–million-gallon storage tank, which will allow the City to establish redundancy to meet peak demands.
Cave Creek Water Supply Interconnect	Town of Cave Creek	\$2,000,000	This project will create a new connection with the City of Phoenix water system to provide a backup drinking water supply for a system that currently relies on a single pipeline to serve its thousands of residents and the Carefree Water Company.
Tucson Randolph Park PFAS Project	City of Tucson	\$2,250,000	This project will build and install a new well and treatment system to maintain and capture an existing PFAS plume. The project will prevent further migration of the PFAS plume into Tucson Water's central wellfield.

This project rehabilitates existing well sites, including pipelines, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation and controls equipment to improve water production, and quality.
Mesa Groundwater Well	City of Mesa	\$1,000,000	This project will install a new groundwater well to provide potable water for the southeast region of Mesa and its surrounding areas. This system will add resiliency to the City's drinking water system, as a critical drought in the region worsens.
Camp Verde Drinking Water System Upgrades	Town of Camp Verde	\$2,000,000	In 2022, Camp Verde purchased a local water system. This project will enable the city to make needed upgrades to the system, to ensure the groundwater meets state and federal water quality targets.
Clarkdale Groundwater Well and Treatment Plan Design	Town of Clarkdale	\$1,000,000	This project will bring a new well, storage tank, and arsenic treatment plant for the Town of Clarkdale by enabling the city to fully plan and design a new water treatment system that adds redundancy and improves regional water quality.
Prescott Valley PFAS Treatment and Recharge Wells	Town of Prescott Valley	\$2,100,000	This project would allow for the removal of PFAS/PFOS from treated wastewater and direct injection of this treated water into the aquifer, which will support regional water conservation efforts while protecting water quality.
Coconino County Upper Rio de Flag Watershed Project	Coconino County	\$2,000,000	In 2022, the Pipeline Fire burned through a significant portion of the Schultz Creek watershed, causing flooding in Flagstaff. The funding will be used for reconstruction of Calle Guadalupe from the I-10 overpass to the town limits. Calle Guadalupe is an important thoroughfare, providing access in and out of the Town of Guadalupe.
Agua Fria Trail Phase 2 Pedestrian Bridge	City of Avondale	\$500,000	This project will improve accessibility for local residents by connecting two separated paths located on the south and north sides of the drainage channel immediately north of I-10.

Ruby Road Bridge over the Potrero Creek and Union Pacific Railroad	Santa Cruz County	\$3,600,000	This project would replace the Ruby Road Bridge over Potrero Creek and create a grade separated crossing for the Union Pacific Railroad line. This would improve safety and connectivity for this underserved community.
Casa Grande Ash Roundabout	City of Casa Grande	\$2,500,000	This project will demolish and mediate an asbestos- filled site for the creation of a new Headquarters Fire Station for the growing city of Casa Grande.
Oro Valley Honeybee Wash Bridge Deck Repairs, AZ	Town of Oro Valley	\$685,000	This project will repair bridge deck delamination and cracking on several bridges within the town's roadway network.
Tolleson I–10 Frontage Road	City of Tolleson	\$3,600,00	This project is to address traffic congestion and safety concerns in the area of 91st Avenue and I-10. Currently, there is not a connection between 99th Ave and 91st Ave at I-10.
Valley Metro Electric Accessible Microtransit Vehicles	Valley Metro	\$1,382,00	This project will allow for the purchase of seven electric accessible small vehicles and related infrastructure connectors to provide more flexible transit options.
Chandler Micro Flex	Valley Metro	\$1,000,000	This project will expand the City of Chandler's microtransit service that provides an on-demand public transportation option for residents. With this assistance, the city will be able to operate in more areas and increase the hours of operation.
Valley Metro Electric Buses	Valley Metro	\$500,000	This project will support Valley Metro's efforts to improve the region's air quality by purchasing five electric buses as well as the associated infrastructure to help transition to a zero-emission bus fleet.
Gila River Linear Park and Trail	Graham County	\$1,300,000	This project will support the construction of the Gila River Linear Park and Trail. These funds will support the first phase, which is a 4.2-mile segment (of a planned overall seven miles) of river trail lying just north of Safford and Thatcher city/town limits.

The Justa Center Building Construction	Area Agency on Aging, Region One, Incorporated	\$850,000	This funding will be used to construct a new building to house the Justa Center, which provides life- sustaining services to older adults experiencing homelessness.

CASS Senior Haven- Emergency Housing for Senior Citizens	Central Arizona Shelter Services	\$1,500,000	This funding will support The Haven Senior Center, which will provide emergency housing for senior citizens in a non-congregate hotel setting with a bed capacity of 170.

Somerton Main Street Redevelopment Project	City of Somerton	\$1,000,000	This project will provide for more effective storm drainage, repavement, and improved sidewalks for Somerton's Main Street, supporting increased economic development.

Hotel Conversion for Senior Permanent Supportive Housing	City of Phoenix	\$3,000,000	This project will provide needed renovations to a 120-room former hotel to convert it to Permanent Supportive Housing for seniors experiencing homelessness.
