Dear Chair Heinrich and Ranking Member Hoeven,

We respectfully ask that you fully fund the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) in the Fiscal Year 2024 Subcommittee on Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Appropriations bill. We recommend robust funding for WIC, including funding to serve projected caseload and an extension of enhanced fruit and vegetable benefits through Fiscal Year 2024, to strengthen WIC's role in improving maternal, infant, and child health outcomes.

WIC is the nation's premiere preventive public health nutrition program serving about 6.3 million low-income women, infants, and young children at nutritional risk each month. Numerous studies show that participation in WIC saves money by improving birth outcomes, reducing pre-term and low birth weight babies, enhancing breastfeeding rates, and reducing the prevalence of childhood obesity. For every dollar invested in WIC, approximately \$2.48 is returned in medical, education, and productivity costs. WIC improves the growth and development of approximately half of all infants born and a quarter of young children in the U.S by ensuring access to healthy and nutritious foods. Since 1998, appropriators of both parties have recognized the great value WIC adds to the nation's nutritional health and have worked to ensure that WIC has sufficient funding to serve all eligible mothers and young children who apply.

We recommend that appropriators sustain this bipartisan commitment, especially as WIC absorbed new and growing costs in the past year. Rising grocery prices affected several food categories that are issued by quantity in the WIC benefit – with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service estimating a 70% increase in egg prices, 16% increase in prices for whole grains and cereals, and 14% increase in dairy prices over the past year. WIC food funds were also depleted addressing the ramifications of Abbott Nutrition's recall of infant formula products, especially as State agencies that do not contract with Abbott offered brand flexibility to assure adequate access for program participants.

WIC shouldered these new costs at a time when program participation continued to increase, largely driven by enhanced retention of child participants. In fiscal year 2024, State agencies are positioned to sustain modern service delivery models that will further reduce barriers to access. The President's Budget estimates that WIC will serve 6.5 million participants in fiscal year 2024, marking a 3.9% increase over fiscal year 2022 participation rates.

We also urge that the expanded WIC fruit and vegetable benefit, which has reached more than 4.75 million women and children, be extended through fiscal year 2024. This benefit was expanded, starting in spring 2021, to bring the WIC food package into better alignment with science-based recommendations laid out by the National Academies of Sciences (NAS) to provide at least 50 percent of daily fruit and vegetable intake recommended by the recent Dietary Guidelines for Americans (DGAs). Recent findings from the National WIC Association and the Nutrition Policy Institute indicate a ¼ cup daily increase in fruit and vegetable intake among participating children following implementation of the enhanced benefit. This increase is also reflected at retail stores and independent grocers, as well as farmers markets, as enhanced benefits resulted in more than triple the amount of fruit and vegetable transactions. This increased economic activity returns investment up the food supply chain, supporting producers and growers. Robust WIC finding should also be inclusive of critical program set-aside priorities authorized by the *Healthy*, *Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010*, including funding to update Management Information Systems, as well as the breastfeeding and infrastructure investments included in recent spending packages.

In addition to providing healthy foods, WIC provides critical health and social service referrals. As a result, children enrolled in WIC are more likely to be immunized on time, consume key nutrients, and have higher cognitive development scores than their peers not participating in WIC. Removing families from the program as a result of funding cuts deprives young children of access to healthy food, a healthy start in life, and the opportunity to thrive.

We strongly urge you to robustly fund WIC in the FY24 Agriculture Appropriations bill and extend the enhanced fruit and vegetable benefits to continue protecting low-income women, infants, and children from hunger and improve their ability to access nutritious, balanced diets. Thank you for consideration of this request.
